Weiler Takes the Reins as General Manager By Todd Schmidt, Clark County Press



Jon Weiler, 49, did not get much time off during his "retirement." Weiler retired from the U.S. Army June 30, 2017 after nearly 28-years in the military, and officially began his duties as General Manager of The Highground July 1. He sat down in the midst of Freedom Day activities at The Highground to reflect on a rewarding military career and his new calling.

Weiler has actually been preparing for the job since June 1st. He shadowed Kirk Rodman, The Highground Volunteer GM, who retired on June 30, 2017.

C.W. King, chairman of The Highground Board of Directors, board members Bob Solberg and Bob Barth, along with Kirk Rodman, served as the interview committee. "Mr. Weiler has the background we were looking for in a GM," King commented. "He impressed the committee members during his interview. We are confident he will do a great job working with the board and staff to continue the success of The Highground Veterans Memorial Park."

Solberg said he was impressed with Weiler's service career and the fact he is a family man. "I think we picked the right person," Solberg said. "He is a super nice fellow who gets along with everyone. He is excited to be at The Highground." Weiler said a few days before the interview, he and his family drove down to The HG Park. "We could feel what this place means to people," Weiler said. "It is very spiritual. We all did a lot of soul searching and praying. We felt like this was where I was meant to be. I guess God put it in front of us at Hardee's." (This is where he saw the position advertised.)

Weiler said he has been very impressed with the quality and dedication of the staff. "They all know their duties very well," he said. They have done an incredible job getting The Highground to where it is today. My job working with the board & staff is to keep on track and moving full speed ahead."

"We will continue to get the word out with an emphasis on veterans' issues," Weiler said. "We need to focus on ways to get younger veterans involved and be a part of what HG is."

"The staff and I are brainstorming on ways to move the Highground to the next level. I am a dreamer and I love to

dream big. There are so many wonderful things this place is and more that it can be"

Weiler is impressed with the way volunteers step up to help. "I am surprised the number of volunteers that give of their time and talents. This place would be nothing without them."

Weiler was asked to summarize his work and military career following his graduation in 1986 from Green Bay West High School. He attended UW-Eau Claire for two years and decided to join the U.S. Army in August 1989. After basic training and AIT, in June 1990, he and Sabrina were married in Green Bay. On July 1, 1990 he was sent to Gelhausen, Germany as part of the 3rd Armored Division.

On Dec. 23, 1990, his unit was deployed as part of the Operation Desert Storm. His unit returned to Germany in 1991. He was transferred to Fort Monmouth, NJ in November of 1991. In February 1992, Weiler was sent to serve for six months at the U.S. Embassy in Egypt. Then it was back for stints at Ft. Monmouth, NJ and Ft. Gordon, GA. In January 1995, Weiler was sent to Saudi Arabia as part of Operation Southern Watch. His job was monitoring all Iraqi air and ground traffic below the 38th Parallel.

His enlistment came up in Feb. 1996, and he decided to get off active duty. He entered the Army Reserve at Ft. McCoy. His initial duty was instructing Army Reserve Soldiers.

The Weiler family moved to Green Bay, where they operated the Stroheim's Frozen Custard restaurant for four years. The restaurant closed in October 2001, about a month after the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks.

The Weiler family moved to Milladore, when he began working at Roehl Transport in Marshfield. In August 2002, Weiler was ordered to report to Ft. Sill, OK for active duty. He was sent to Camp Doha, Kuwait in February 2003. Weiler worked as a Foreign Disclosure Officer for the Combined Forces Land Component Command. He returned to Ft. McCoy in March 2004, where he served as an instructor and training coordinator.

In May 2007, Weiler attended warrant officer candidate school at Ft. Rucker, AL. In July, he moved on to Peterson AFB in Colorado Springs, where he joined the First Space Brigade. In that position, Weiler traveled worldwide.

In October 2012, he was deployed to Qatar as part of US Centcom. He returned to Peterson AFB in October 2013, serving there until October 2015, when he reported to Ft. Sheridan, IL. He served at the Army Reserve Intelligence Support Center there until his retirement.

"My family and I are humbled and excited about this opportunity," Weiler said. "We are also anxious to see what we can do in the community."

The Highground Bike Tour, in its 33rd year, is the largest single annual fundraiser for The Highground. The Bike Tour takes year round planning by the dedicated route leaders. These leaders and most of the bike riders also raise a great sum of money by gathering pledges and donations. Annually, the Bike Tour brings in over \$40,000 for the Highground.

The 1st Bike Tour, ridden by Highground Founder Tom Miller, rode 1244 miles—one mile for each Wisconsin KIA/MIA from Vietnam. He rode around the state of Wisconsin, touching each border, to raise awareness (and funds) for the Wisconsin Vietnam Veterans Memorial Project, Inc. a/k/a The Highground.

As can be seen on the map on the Bike Tour poster, each route travels an independent route - most starting on Friday - and ending the journey on Sunday, when all routes convene at The Highground.

The Highground thanks all the riders that have returned yearly to take part in this amazing event and looks forward to seeing new riders join! Veterans Day Ceremony at The Highground

The Highground Veterans Park will observe Veterans Day on Saturday, November 11th. At Noon, the names of the 1,244 Wisconsin KIAs/MIAs in the Vietnam War and 877 names of the Wisconsin KIAs/MIAs in the Korean War will be read and honored with the tolling of the Liberty Bell.

The Veterans Day ceremony will start at 3:00pm. It will be held outdoors on the plaza unless the weather is very inclement. In that event, it will be held indoors in The Learning Center.

Veteran, John Black, from Iola will be the guest speaker. The names of the Wisconsin service men and women who have died in the Persian Gulf conflicts, including Iraq and Afghanistan, and others will be read as part of the ceremony. Volunteers are needed to read the names at Noon. Please contact The Highground to be a part of this meaningful day.



Military Working Dog Tribute



The Highground's newest tribute is making progress. The site has been chosen, leveled, base poured, tribute placed and pavers getting set. Soon stones will be sold for this area.

The Board of Directors have approved black polished granite blocks to be placed upright on the tribute's base. For \$150, a line can be created to list the handler's name, their dog's name and conflict. This is a work-in-progress. As enough names are gathered to complete a block, the order will be sent to the engraver and purchasers will be notified when the block will be installed. Listing on the block will be first come—first listed. More information to follow.

The Board has also approved the \$525 donation for the 12"x12"x2" honor stones that will become the floor of the Tribute's surrounding area. At this time, no dates of placement have been set—but we are getting close.

Long Shadow Memories of Vietnam - The Murals of David Ciffey

When another generation of American soldiers was sent to invade a distant nation at the start of the Gulf War in 1991, David Giffey began work on the *Long Shadow* series of paintings by examining hundreds of photographs he took in 1965-66 as a combat journalist with the 1st Infantry Division during the war in Vietnam. The images in each painting refer to the photos. He also chose excerpts from a journal he kept during the war to accompany each.

Completed in 2013, his hope is to illustrate his dismal, frightening, and emotional memories of war.

He didn't anticipate the unexpected impressions of bloody explosions, violence, and loneliness that the work brought forth. "Not a single day has passed in 50 years when I am not aware of some aspect—a detail—of the war in Vietnam." Included with this display is a soundtrack of music important to the artist during the war era.


Every war, past, present, and yet to come, casts a shadow of trauma. Veterans return home with a long shadow

permanently attached to their psyches, and the shadow is cast onto their families, friends, and communities.



*Kiln-glass (or kilnformed glass) objects are made with glass fused when heated in a kiln. Once assembled as desired and heated in a kiln, the glasses soften, fuse together, and assume the shape of whatever surface they're resting upon or within, such as a flat kiln shelf, curved mold, or casting mold.
