Planning Farther Ahead: 2019 Heroes Ride

Tom Kingsbury, on his third decade of riding bicycle for The Highground, will be riding a Heroes Ride in late July 2019 (ending at The Highground on August 4, 2019). He will be riding a circuitous route around Wisconsin as well as journeying into the neighboring states to raise awareness of The Highground and important veteran's issues.

In 1984, Tom Miller, Highground Founder, rode the first bicycle ride of 1,244 miles—a mile for each Wisconsin Vietnam KIA/MIA.

In 2009, Tom Kingsbury did a similar ride honoring the 25th Anniversary of the first ride. He rode 1,527 miles in ten days raising awareness and funds for The Highground Veterans Park. (A mile for each KIA/MIA: Vietnam thru 7/2009.)

In 2019, ten years later (35th Anniversary), Kingsbury will ride over 1500 miles honoring all who served.



The 2017 Honor Stone ceremonies filled quickly—thank you for the support!

Notice of price changes: stones have not had a price increase in over eight years, but the costs continue to rise for obtaining the stones and engraving. Therefore, prices will be increased January 1, 2018. Those purchasing the stones before then will receive 2017's current prices.



Stones Available at The Highground

There are five types of honor stones to consider at The Highground. Legacy Stones are placed on our walkway; Meditation Stones are limited in number and will be placed on the floor of the Meditation Garden Shelter; Korean Honor Stones are placed in the Korean Tribute walkway; Persian Gulf Honor Stones are placed in *the Bootprint* of the Wisconsin Persian Gulf Tribute; and Military Working Dog Stones placed on the Tribute's base.

The wording on the stones should emulate a "living legacy". Please refrain from using birth/death dates and phrases such as "in memory of" on the stones. Only letters and numbers are used, no punctuation or special characters. Ideas for items to be included are service dates, branch of service, rank, medals, and inspirational phrases. For birthdays, anniversaries, and other celebrations, we will send one certificate (on patriotic paper) to the donor to give to the recipient.

All honor stone tributes include the use of The Registry. The Registry contains personal letters, memories, and pictures that tell a story about the recipient of the stone and is kept in the Learning Center Library. You can submit these materials at any time, plus continue to add to the Registry as time passes and more information is gathered.

The ceremony begins with the presentation of colors; a volunteer leads the group in the Pledge of Allegiance and singing the National Anthem. Earth from the previous stone ceremony is mixed with the earth from the day's ceremony. Everyone will have the opportunity to share thoughts of their honoree, *if they choose*, with the other visitors. Each family then places their stone. For those planning a picnic or luncheon celebration before or after the ceremony, picnic shelters are available on the grounds. (Reservations are suggested.)

Yellow Ribbons






