

January—March Learning Center Exhibits



Working Warriors: Military Life Beyond Combat exhibit features the almost 75% of military work that is considered non-combat. These roles rarely make the headlines, but are vital to every military operation. Exploring the non-combat roles of military service personnel, including work as beauticians, military police, dentists, mechanics, and photographers, this exhibit showcases an often overlooked but highly relatable side of military life.



Fur, Feathers and Fidelity: Military Mascots exhibit features mascots and their important service in the military. Whether a lion, a monkey, or a dog, military mascots are a source of pride and morale for troops.

The Military Working Dog Tribute

We were so close!!! And then came the rain, then snow... Landscaping once again needed to be put on hold until the spring. With that said, the dedication of this beautiful Military Working Dog Tribute is *going to be* Saturday, June 2, 2018 at 1:00pm.

The Board of Directors have approved black polished granite blocks to be placed upright on the tribute's base. For \$150, a line can be created to list the handler's name, their dog's name and conflict. This is a work-in-progress. As enough names are gathered to complete a block, the order will be sent to the engraver and purchasers will be notified when the block will be installed. Listing on the blocks will be first come—first listed.

The Board has also approved the \$525 donation for the 12"x12"x2" honor stones that will become the base of the Tribute's surrounding area. At this time, no placement dates have been set—but we *are* getting close.

Message from the Board Chair.... The Highground Board of Directors met on Saturday October 10/28/2017 so I am using this opportunity to bring everyone up to date on the state of The Highground. The BOD discussed where we are with the plans for a Welcome Center, and while we are in agreement that we will not be building a welcome center as once planned, we are in agreement that we will need to do something to continue to focus more on our mission of healing and education. The plans for exactly how we will do this, remain fluid at this time. We feel we need more space to provide PTSD counseling as we continue to have people request this much needed service on site. The Board discussed several items of maintenance that you will hear more about as the planning for next spring's annual work week continues.

We had a report from the Clark County Forester about what we need to do to maintain our standing timber. He will be bringing a complete report, hopefully at our January meeting. Finally, the Board discussed the need to recruit more new members. January is our organizational meeting, and we likely have at least one

member who will be leaving the Board. If you are interested in serving on the Board of Directors, or know someone who may be interested, contact Jon at The Highground office and he will explain the expectations for a Board Member. Difficult as it is to believe, some of us are getting on in years and new members are always needed. —CW

Message from the General Manager... Winter is almost here. The chill in the air is a sharp awakening that it is time to get out the cold weather gear. It doesn't make any difference how prepared for this season we are, it is going to slap us in the face anyway, so may as well get ready because, as we used to say as kids, "Ready or not, here I come!"

The Highground has had an extremely successful 2017 and is really excited about 2018. Our calendar of events is set so make sure you check out details on the website at thehighground us or (most preferably), stop in and grab the schedule from one of our very welcoming staff or Volunteers.

We are so blessed to have this incredible Staff and amazing group of Volunteers!

The Highground Board of Directors (BOD) has met several times since August to discuss where we are going to go in the future. We have talked about our needs and how we can focus more on our mission of healing and education. Many of you are aware that we planned on building a new Welcome Center. In September we received the final bid for the project and it came in at \$2.5 million dollars, which was way beyond what anyone had expected. The BOD unanimously agreed that we could not be fiscally responsible if we went forward with this project.

The BOD asked the Staff what we felt was needed to ensure that we were putting our emphasis on our mission of healing and education. We determined that we need private counseling offices for PTSD counseling; a larger meeting room to accommodate 75–150 people; better parking; and storage for our equipment. We are still in discussion as to how to achieve these needs but rest assured we will be letting everyone know once a decision is made and that we WILL be doing it within our means.

Another area of discussion has been the necessity to recruit new Board Members. As CW so graciously said in his letter from the Chairman of the Board, "some of us are getting on in years and new members are always a good idea". We are looking for veterans who have a valid DD214, can come to 4 quarterly meetings a year and would be committed to our mission of healing and education. Tomah VA Residential Combat Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) program.

Coming home from war can present challenges for the returning military service member and veterans. Some service members or veterans struggle to find their way back home and get stuck in a rut. A service member or veteran can often start to feel isolated, broken, constantly on guard, and struggle to participate in daily situations (e.g. going to restaurant, time with family, going shopping). This can become something known as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). There is help available to assist eligible veterans.

Many service members or veterans have tried outpatient counseling or therapy. Are you looking for that next step? If so, there is another option available; the Tomah VA has a Residential Combat Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) program. This 9 week residential program has been serving local Wisconsin and out of state combat veterans for many decades. The program is designed to help them combat their struggles with PTSD and related difficulties. This 13 bed program provides intensive PTSD treatment for veterans whom served in various tours of War such as Iraq, Afghanistan, Desert Storm, Vietnam, Korea, and so forth. Each veteran whom comes to our program becomes part of the community. They often feel part of something again as they bond with fellow brothers and sisters. Our veterans report feeling like they are back in their unit or squad again. They often tell us how comfortable they feel with the staff here as they receive intensive individual and group treatment. They get opportunities to fight their triggers directly through structured exercises. They also tell us that it's hard work to do the program but tell us it's worth it in the end as they feel better after they have been through it.

The Tomah VA Residential Combat PTSD Program participates in treatment activities in the community. The Highground has been part of those activities for the last 15 years. Maybe you are considering getting some help for yourself? Maybe you're a family member who is looking for help for your veteran? Maybe you have been to the program before and are on the fence about coming back for some more help? Give us a call. For more info, please call our admission coordinator at (608) 372-1758.

Honored guest speakers were Jon E. Litscher, Secretary of the




E. Litscher, Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Corrections and Col. David J. Monk, US Army (Ret.)










Rhapsody in Olive Drab by Steve Maddox


