

30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of The Highground and "Fragments", The Vietnam Veteran's Tribute Yellow Ribbon Campaign & Parade

Volunteers Needed - How You And Your Community Can Get Involved





Veterans' posts, communities and individuals have been, and are now, working diligently on creating thousands of large yellow ribbons to be placed on the main thoroughfares throughout Central Wisconsin. When veterans travel to The Highground for the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary event, no matter which direction they come from, they will be driving through yellow-ribbon lined corridors. Sheila Nyberg of Clark County Economic Development and Tourism has developed this massive project from the simple idea of having yellow ribbons up just near The Highground and in the neighboring towns of Neillsville for a small veterans parade prior to the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary ceremony. She has brought her endless energy

and enthusiasm for the project and made it a multiple-county effort! If there are communities, organizations or individuals that would like more information on getting yellow ribbons for this event, contact Sheila at 715-255-9100.

As of July 1<sup>st</sup>, these Central WI communities have joined the Yellow Ribbon Campaign: Pittsville, Pray, Loyal, Greenwood, Marshfield, Colby, Thorp, Dorchester and Neillsville. Make sure *your* community becomes involved and has Yellow Ribbons made to put up on September 17<sup>th</sup>. The ribbons should be able to withstand Mother Nature and remain up until November 12<sup>th</sup>, in honor of veterans of all eras.

The Yellow Ribbon Campaign and Parade is already having a healing effect for many different reasons. One healing effect is what was originally intended by holding the event; that Vietnam veterans and their families be honored and "Welcomed Home" as a group. Another healing effect is from the civilian point of view — a chance to honor and remember these veterans. Yet another form of healing has been happening from the preparation to the "Welcome Home". There are people that either did not welcome the Vietnam veterans home or had acted in ways that they now regret when the veterans returned home. This is their second chance to both welcome home the veterans and to make peace with themselves for actions or non-actions of the past. Loved ones of those killed in Vietnam and of those Vietnam veterans that are no longer with us will be able to feel that their pain is shared by others and that their loved one is rightfully honored and remembered. It will be a time of closure for many different types of wounds.




# The Highground Comes to Life with Highground Education Days!




The other day, I was asked to describe the Learning Center to someone that has never been here. My first thought was .... What if I had never had the opportunity to see it? What if I had never been to The Highground? So I responded with this, "The Learning Center is made up of a gallery and museum on the first floor and a 4000+ book library, video viewing room and registry book room (everyone who has an Honor Stone placed at The Highground has the honoree's name put in the registry



books for future generations to read "the rest of the story") all in the lower level. Currently in the museum are displays from WWI through the present war, it's one room at this time but I have hopes for future expansion.

The Highground is unique in that we are not a *war* memorial, but a **veterans** memorial, manned year round. Our grounds are open to the public 24/7 and our Gift Shop and Learning Center are open 9 - 5 daily, 361 days a year. Another amazing note about The Highground is that we are non-profit and thrive due to the overwhelming support of our donors and volunteers. If you ever are able to visit The Highground, you will be able to feel the healing nature of this place. There aren't words to describe it, it's just such a profound feeling."




**Tomah VA** Residential Combat Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) program.

# Honor, Heal, Remember

The Highground Memorial Day ceremony took place on Monday, May 28th . Several hundred people, including over 300 riders of the 8th Annual Honor Ride Motorcycle Rally, gathered for the afternoon program. At 11:30 volunteers read the over 2,000 names of those from Wisconsin who were KIA from the Korean War to present day. The Highground Memorial Day ceremony began at 3pm with a presentation by the Color Guard of the Loyal American Legion Post #175. Highground Executive Director, Jon Weiler, welcomed everyone to the ceremony and Tom Barten led the crowd in the singing of The National Anthem. The first guest speaker was Joel Brockman,

Gold Star Father of Andrew Wallace, who was killed in action in Iraq on September 26, 2005. Joel spoke of Andrew's dedication to serving his country. Major General Donald P. Dunbar, Adjutant General of Wisconsin, was the keynote speaker and helped all remember the service and sacrifices of Wisconsin men and women in combat from the Civil War through today. The program concluded with a rifle salute by the Loyal American Legion Post #175 and "Taps" performed by Judy Zettler.

The 30th Anniversary event will kick off on Friday, September 21st with exhibits and presentations at The Highground. Steve Conto will present his "Final Bridge" continuing project in which he locates and cares for the gravesites of WI Vietnam KIAs. His mission has taken him far away from WI as he continues this meaningful program. Steve will have an exhibit on the "Final Bridge" and he will also have a Vietnam memorial that he has constructed based on the Vietnam Wall in D.C., which shows the names of the Wisconsin KIAs in the places they are listed on the D.C. memorial.

Wisconsin Public Television's "A Face for Every Name" Vietnam KIA display / memorial will be at The Highground's Learning Center. Bryce Kelley, originator of the idea of this display will give a presentation on Friday or Saturday on the history of the exhibit.

There will be other exhibits throughout the weekend including a static display of a UH-1H Huey helicopter trailered by VVA #331; Lao Hmong history; Vietnam War book signings; Vet Center; VA PTSD & Addiction Recovery information; and more. There will also be family events at the Learning Center to make it an enjoyable day for the youngest visitors.

Saturday, Sept. 22<sup>nd</sup>, will be a day of public recognition of Vietnam Veterans. A Yellow Ribbon Veterans Parade (in vehicles, not walking) will take place through Neillsville, bringing veterans to The Highground Veterans Memorial Park. Veterans and posts interested in joining the parade need to contact Theresa at The Highground to register. 
# Rhapsody in Olive Drab by Steve Maddox
