New Executive Director Chris Pettis takes the lead at The Highground

The Highground Veterans Memorial Park is proud to announce the appointment of Mr. Chris Pettis as Executive Director. Chris comes to The Highground with a wealth of knowledge, an extensive military background, and leadership experience.

"We are very excited for Chris to join The Highground team," said Gary Weirauch, Vice Chair of The Highground Board of Directors. "Chris's natural leadership qualities really impressed us during the interview process. We also learned that PTSD has personally impacted Chris's life which we strongly feel will give him the ability to relate to our Veterans."

Chris, a graduate of Eau Claire Memorial High School, enlisted in the United States Marine Corps shortly after high school.

During his 23-year career as a Marine, he held several positions including Field Radio Operator, Electronic-Optical Repair Technician, Instructor and Ordnance Chief. He was stationed at numerous bases in the U.S., including 29 Palms, CA and Camp Lejeune, NC. He deployed to Somalia, Indonesia, the Philippines, Kuwait, and Iraq.

Upon retirement as a Master Sergeant in 2014, Chris, his wife Bonnie, son Austin, and daughter Myrisa, moved from Jacksonville, NC to Osseo, WI, while their oldest daughter Morgan moved to California after college graduation. Chris started a new career in the mining industry, where he operated a shovel, before advancing to a jobsite foreman, a position he held for the last 3 years.

"I feel blessed to be a part of something so special. I can still remember how I felt the first time I attended a stone ceremony, seeing what The Highground means to other Veterans and their families," Chris said. "I'm fortunate to work with a staff that is passionate about supporting The Highground mission. I especially look forward to meeting the dedicated volunteers and donors who are so vital to our success. Without them, there is no us."

Chris is excited about the future of The Highground as well as the addition of Camp Victory and the many ways it can be used to facilitate healing and education for so many Veterans. One of his major goals is to encourage younger veterans to visit the park and become a part of its future.

STUDY SUPPORTS FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN TO EXPAND THE HIGHGROUND

The Highground Board of Directors has approved a contract with Crescendo Fundraising Professionals, LLC to initiate a \$3.75 to \$4M capital campaign to respond to growth of the organization and to improve the visitor experience and services for its 225,000 annual visitors.

The campaign is based on a recently completed Campaign Readiness Study which confirmed that the capital campaign expansion is justifiable, has merit, and carries urgency. The results were identified from The Highground stakeholders, donors, and area philanthropic leaders. The funding capacity to meet the studied goal of \$7.5M was found to be unavailable at this time with a recommendation to respond to those elements at a future time based on fundraising success.

From its founding by Tom Miller and a small group of Vietnam veterans in 1984, the organization has grown to a 155-acre memorial park hosting more than 225,000 visitors annually and serves 6,000 to 8,000 veterans with individual referral, support, and healing services. The main campus includes the museum and visitor center, a library of military collections, 19 tributes dedicated to veterans' groups and service eras, a Meditation Garden, and trails which crisscross hills and valleys featuring a breathtaking landscape. A recently donated campground retreat, Camp Victory,

located approximately 20 miles from the main campus, is comprised of 300 acres and expands the organization's capacity to provide retreats for veterans and their families which will be fully developed in the coming years.

Recognizing the need to expand to better accommodate increased visitor interest, the Board of Directors began exploring the idea of a building expansion project and fundraising campaign in 2018. According to the Board of Directors President, C.W. King, "Through this study our donors have helped us determine the parameters for a successful campaign, and we are grateful for the input to help us set the course for the best future for the organization."

Stakeholders' input identified the following elements to address for the expansion campaign funds:

- Pay off the organization's \$750,000 mortgage to increase financial stability and long-term sustainability
- A new larger welcome and visitor center to house meeting, programming space and exhibits
- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliance to ensure disabled veterans and all visitors are able to access all elements of the park and memorial sites
- Parking changes for safer access as funds allow

The Campaign Readiness Study provided the opportunity for respondents to share their ideas and thoughts, helped identify top leadership potential, evaluated the fundraising climate and favorable conditions, identified possible challenges, and developed a preliminary timeline for the campaign. According to Ellen Hongerholt, M.A., Crescendo Fundraising Professionals, LLC owner, "The Highground is a special place. It is obviously treasured by visitors who know the healing experience found there by veterans, veterans' families, and others who care about and honor the sacrifice of our country's military."

Hongerholt and her team of three advisors will manage the capital campaign process set to begin planning stages in April. After all the planning steps have been completed, informational sessions will begin to educate and engage individuals, organizations, and businesses about the expansion throughout the summer. The Highground Annual Bike Tour will continue in 2020 (if the COVID-19 ban is lifted by then), with a new name and its own brand. Progress continues on programming for Camp Victory!

The summer and fall of 2019 have seen Camp Victory continue the mission and welcome home Veterans from all eras of service. Camp Victory's programs this past year have allowed Veterans to heal from the emotional wounds of war.

This past fall, Camp Victory saw fifty Veterans in five different groups experience a traditional Wisconsin bow hunt. The hunt was a great experience but the healing, camaraderie and new friends made were the highlight. The groups included Disabled Veterans, Vietnam Veterans, Purple Heart Veterans, WI Combat Veterans and Persian Gulf Veterans. To help run the hunt for each group, six volunteers were needed per hunt. The majority of the volunteers were Veterans themselves and enjoyed the experience just as much as the hunters. A common theme experienced by all participants was that for many years opportunities were turned down to do other hunts but through the sharing of stories and sense of camaraderie this hunt allowed healing to start and continue.

Camp Victory looks forward to another year of fulfilling The Highground mission to heal Veterans. Adding to this experience Mary Haupt from the La Crosse Vet Center, has volunteered to bring her extensive experience in treating PTSD to Camp. She is teaming up with Camp Victory to create a program that treats Veterans with PTSD along with their family. Her innovative approach will allow not only Veterans to heal but the families, also.

FACILITY UPGRADE FUNDS STILL NEEDED

In December we asked for your help to complete some of the facility projects at The Highground. We were struck, once again, by the generosity of our donors to help us keep the park the nation's premiere manned Veterans Memorial Park. In December, over \$20,000 was raised to help us with our projects. Thank you so much for your support!

Because of this, we anticipate that we will be able to complete the rebuilding of the Meditation Garden Pathway. A rubber surface that matches the current color of the rocks in the Meditation Garden that will allow for greater ADA accessibility. It could not get done without the help of so many donors! There is still more work to be done though.

One of our biggest concerns going into this year are two projects; the first being the a filtration system for the water at the park. We anticipate that the costs of these repairs will be close to \$10,000. Currently the minerals in the water leave a residue on the stones and tributes that it touches, mostly the "Fountain of Tears" and "The Korean" Tributes. While it can be cleaned off, the residue is harming the metal and the granite.

The second concern is the Persian Gulf Tribute. The original design did not anticipate that the stones bordering the "bootprint" would be there. The original design called for plants. An adjustment was made to move the benches out and replace the plants with honor stones. Because of this change, there needs to be an adjustment to the support of those stones. The anticipated cost of this will be about

\$8500 for concrete to put under the stones.

We already have the commitment from the volunteers to do the leg-work! We can do this with your support! PARK

- **Summer Fertilizer and weed control-\$2000** to ensure that the grounds stay gorgeous and plush, and to make sure we keep the weeds out which drive up our maintenance costs by mowing excessively.
- **Plants for Meditation Garden-\$1500** While we are updating the Meditation Garden with the new walkway, this seemed like a good time to update the bushes that are not sustainable in the current zone. - **Water Filtration System for Park-\$10,000** you will notice around the park that in a couple of areas have a whitened tint to them, this is caused by the minerals that collect from the water, we would like to put a new filtration system in that would cure this issue and not do anymore damage to the tributes that this is effecting
