2021 VETERAN RETREATS

The Highground Veterans Retreats offer three days of food, fun and workshops, most based on outdoor activities, to bring enjoyment and new experiences to Veterans in a peaceful setting of camaraderie. These are not professional counseling retreats, but many veterans have found the retreats have brought them healing as they work their way through issues including PTSD and have gone away with new interests, friendships and hobbies to continue when they return home. The retreats are conducted with guidance and participation of the Vet Center, Healing Oaks Forest Therapy, The Heartbeat Center for Arts & Literature and many other skilled organizations.

Male Veterans Retreat – July 9-11: At this time, the Retreat is planned to be based at The Highground's Camp Victory.

Female Veterans Retreat – Sept 10-12: The Retreat lodging will be at the Moraine Motel adjacent to The Highground, with workshops primarily at The Highground and Camp Victory.

HOMELESS VETERANS DRIVE UPDATE

We received an amazing amount of donations for our Homeless Veteran Donation Drive!

Through the generosity of a great number of organizations and individuals, The Highground was able to donate thousands of items to help homeless Veterans and Veterans in need during the harsh winter. The equivalent of 56 six-foot long tables were filled during the collection "push" which happened from November–February. The items were very well-chosen by donors and were primarily the most requested items of new socks, hand warmers, winter outerwear, boots, non-perishable food, toiletries, sleeping bags and blankets. Generous donors were able to donate the very gently used items along with LOTS of brand new items – some items were shipped directly to The Highground from the retailer! Everything was distributed directly to homeless Veterans and Veterans in need through the Chippewa Veterans Assistance Foundation and The Hands Foundation through their partnership with "Every 3rd Saturday" Veterans outreach.

FROM THE CHAIR Gary Weirauch



Let me start by thanking everyone who donated to The Highground this past year. The amount of your gift is of lessor importance than the fact you gave what you could—helping us continue our mission to Honor, Educate and Heal. COVID limited our ability to keep the Gift Shop open, tempering our revenue, but you stepped up when we needed you the most. We receive no tax dollars, never charge Park entrance or Museum admission fees and yet we were able to exceed our budget last year due to your generosity. We did receive a Payroll Protection loan in the amount of \$46,000 (which is in the process of being forgiven) which helped us continue operations with a minimum of furloughed employees even as we had to limit indoor admittance. Your support has been truly amazing.

As you will note in other areas of this newsletter and on our website, we are embarking on a major campaign—to build a new Welcome

Center, make the grounds of the Park more accessible, pay down our obligations and fund Camp Victory updates. We wish to secure funding through our donor network this year and begin building in the spring of 2022. We are excited to embark on this new endeavor and will need your donations now as much as ever. Please consider a contribution to our capital campaign or a donation to our general operating account to continue supporting the mission.

Because of the tax law changes of three years ago, it is harder to itemize deductions and therefore receive a tax break for your philanthropy. There are two ways that you can contribute and save tax dollars without having to itemize. The first is to contribute directly from your individual retirement account. If you have reached the age of 72 1/2, you are eligible to have your IRA administrator send your contribution to The Highground directly from your IRA without having to claim the distribution as income. Since most people are paying over 20% of their IRA distribution to the government in the form of taxes, this makes your contribution more tax friendly or allows you to give a larger contribution. If you have not reached the afore mentioned golden age, you can still contribute on a tax advantaged basis. Anyone who has a brokerage account probably has a stock or two which has a significant gain and the gain could be taxed at 20% federal plus state. If you give this stock to The Highground, you will not pay the tax on the gain AND you will have an itemizable deduction equal to the current value of the stock on the day of the gift.

If you wish to help via either of these methods, we can supply a form needed for your IRA administrator. We also have a form for your stockbroker although we may need to speak with him/her due to transfer logistics. If you are willing to donate, we stand ready to help in the process. Please call The Highground at 715-743-4224 to speak to the appropriate individual. Donors will **always** be the life blood of The Highground.

FROM THE DIRECTOR Chris Pettis



Thankfully, 2020 is in our rearview mirror! However, many of the events from 2020 are still affecting us today. As Americans, we are strong and resilient and will overcome challenges that carried over into 2021. Some challenges may take longer than others, but we will persevere. During my military service, several sayings helped me through some uncomfortable times: "Don't sweat the small stuff; it's all small stuff" and, "No matter how bad you think you have it, someone has it worse." Mind you, these sayings have been cleaned up for professional reading, but the takeaway is this: If we focus on the things that inconvenience us, we are not able to focus on our mission or see other opportunities.

Often, we find obstacles and roadblocks in our path which lead us into making a choice: do we find a way around it, challenge it head on or just give up? At times, making these decisions can be overwhelming.

We need people in our lives who will be there for us and provide the guidance and support in our time in need. Those people are most likely already in your life. The question is, can you ask them?

As I reflect on my time in the Marine Corps, I firmly believe and am occasionally reminded that from Day One to the end of my service, we were not thrown into situations to face our struggles unarmed and alone. When we struggle with effects of wartime trauma, grief or loss, deployments away from family, or even the ability to make sense of our own lives, there are others who can—and will—assure us that we are not fighting the battle alone. If you lost someone who was dear to you, I am truly sorry for your loss. Please realize that you are the keeper of that loved one's story, but most importantly you are the vessel in which those stories are shared so they will never be forgotten.

GOLD STAR REPAIR

If you visited the park during 2020, you may have noticed that our tribute to Gold Star Families has not remained in the same condition as the day it was dedicated. With every rainfall, sand washes down to the bottom of the star and often outside its borders. It also appeared as though it was being used as a large sand box for two and four-legged critters. As the new Meditation Garden walkway was being installed, it sparked an idea to use the same binder to repair the Gold Star. The Highground staff and a few volunteers named Jim started making what we feel is a permanent solution to these problems



(Please know that no harm was inflicted on animals or children). We are using the binder with the sand. Once dry, the surface will be hard, preventing erosion and foot/paw/hoof prints and thus eliminating the innocent desecration of such a meaningful tribute. Thank you to all involved in this large undertaking, to include Mr. and Mrs. Miller for your donated time and materials to relocate the electrical box outside the Gold Star.


